GENERAL RULES OF THE SHOW

Rules: These rules were designed to create a fair and safe show for the maximum number of riders. Please do NOT ask us to waive a particular rule ‘just for your child’.

Safety: Safety is of paramount importance. A Judge must order from the ring any unruly horse or one whose actions threaten to endanger the rider, other exhibitors, or their entries.

Fatigue of Horses/Children: A Judge must excuse from the ring any horse or child showing signs of excessive fatigue or abuse.

Eligible Riders: This Horse Show is for participants in the Jamboree Clinics who will NOT be showing in the Class “A” Show. Riders/Handlers in the Class “A” show are NOT eligible for this show. Eligible Horses may be cross entered if shown by different riders.

Walk/Trot or Walk/Trot/Canter: Riders/handlers may either show in the W/T Classes OR the W/T/C Classes, not both. They may NOT change from W/T to W/T/C when they change divisions. Eligible horses may be shown in both W/T and W/T/C by a different rider/handler.

Age of Rider: Junior Exhibitors shall not have reached their 18th birthday prior to December 1, 2006.

Running Martingales: Horses which are being shown in a simple snaffle bit may be shown in a running martingale.

Registration Requirements: None. Horses of any breed may be shown.

Saddles: Saddle must be appropriate for style of riding; i.e., flat saddle for Country Pleasure and Saddle Seat Equitation, stock saddle for Western Pleasure and Western Equitation; forward seat Saddle for Hunter Pleasure, Hunt Seat Equitation, Working Hunter Over Fences, and Equitation Over Fences, and dressage or forward seat saddle for Dressage, Dressage Seat Equitation, and Sport Horse Under Saddle.

Bridles: Unless the horse is shown in a simple snaffle [without or with a running martingale] bridles should be appropriate for style of riding; saddle seat bridle for Country Pleasure and Saddle Seat Equitation, Western style bridle for Western Pleasure and Western Equitation; plain hunter style bridle for Hunter Pleasure, Hunt Seat Equitation, Working Hunter Over Fences, and Equitation Over Fences, and dressage or plain hunter style bridle for Dressage, Dressage Seat Equitation, and Sport Horse Under Saddle.

Attire: Attire consisting of boots, appropriate riding pants and riding shirt, which shall be neat and clean. Riders MUST wear an ASTM/SEI approved protective helmet regardless of their style of riding. **No coats or chaps allowed.** This creates a more level playing field for all exhibitors. **Please do not ask us to make an exception for your child.**

Large Classes: Larger classes will be split in the interest of safety.

Rating and Fees: The Jamboree Un Rated Clinic Participant Show is NOT an AHA, USEF or USDF approved show. The AHA and USEF Non-Member Fees, and the USEF Drug Fee, do NOT apply in these classes.

Stallions: May not be shown.

Liability: Neither Region XII, its officers or officials, nor any of the sponsors of the show, will be responsible for any accidents or damages done to any owner, driver, groom, attendant, or their equipment.

Entry Forms: All entry forms MUST be signed. No person under 18 may sign an entry form. All entry forms must be accompanied by check or money order to cover all fees and one class entry fee; other classes may be entered in advance without prepayment. Please refer to rules on Entry Policy, Adding, Changing or Scratching Classes at Show, and Refunds.

Entry Policy: Please try to enter all your classes in advance. It is MUCH easier for staff to scratch a horse than to add a horse. You must prepay entry fees for one class. You must leave a blank, signed check at the show office to pick up your exhibitor’s package, if you plan to run a tab or have pre-paid for only one entry fee.

Add/Change Classes at Show: Classes added or changed at the show are not considered Post Entries. NOTE: An adult’s signature is required to add/change/scratch; children MAY NOT submit forms. All scratches MUST be made at the show office.

PA System: Due to unforeseen problems with any electrical device, the PA system and paddock calls over that system must be considered a courtesy. It is the responsibility of the exhibitor to be sure that his horse is at the gate at the prescribed time. And, while every effort will be made to maintain a working PA system to carry call, no protest will be upheld nor will any section be changed on the basis of a PA malfunction alone.

Tack Changes: Classes will be called promptly. Exhibitors are cautioned that if entering the same horse or rider in successive classes, a tack change should be arranged for with the Paddock Manager. You will be given time to complete your tack change IF AND ONLY IF it was arranged in advance. In the interest of good sportsmanship, exhibitors are requested to always check in with the Paddock Manager. This courtesy will minimize delays between classes thereby showing consideration for fellow exhibitors and show workers. Your cooperation will be appreciated.

Lead Line: Open to riders who are at least two [2] years of age and have not reached their seventh [7th] birthday as of December 1. Leaders must be at least fourteen [14] years of age. The safety of all exhibitors must be of primary consideration when conducting these classes. Any action by any exhibitor, leader or horse that endangers that exhibitor or any other exhibitor or leader must be penalized and will be considered as cause for elimination. Safety is of the utmost importance in tack and attire. [a.] Saddle must fit rider. [b.] Rider’s feet must be engaged in the stirrups/irons. [c.] Saddles may be equipped with hooded stirrups or breakaway irons. [d.] Leading rein may be attached to a cavesson or a halter placed under or over the bridle. Leading rein may not be attached to the bit. [e.] Safety helmets, with chin straps, must be used by any rider, regardless of style of tack and/or attire. [f.] Boots, long pants and long sleeve shirts are required. There shall be only one rider on each horse entered. This class will not be placed and similar awards will be presented to all exhibitors.

Beginner Rider Classes: Riders in these classes are not eligible for any other classes. Entries are limited to beginner riders who participated in the Jamboree Walk/Trot Clinics. Attendants are allowed in the ring. Riders may enter 902 & 903 OR 904 & 905.

Working Hunter: Horse and Rider are Limited to One Division. A horse may be shown by another rider in an additional division.
